See how many squares and activities you can cross off. Mrs. Cherry

Draw 8 circles on a sheet of paper. Use a circle template such as ajar, a cup or a lid. Turn each circle into a picture. Ex: a smiley face, donut, flower, etc. Color each picture.

Mixing colors. Our primary colors are red, yellow and blue. Use watercolors, markers, or crayons to mix the primary colors. Just using those 3 colors, what new colors can you make?

There is a channel on YouTube called Art for Kids Hub. There are several videos that will teach you how to draw. Pick
your favorite drawing and follow along.

Warm colors: red, orange and yellow. Cool colors: green, blue and purple. Make a drawing of snowmen coloring them with warm and cool colors.

Texture is how something feels. A sidewalk is rough, a bunny is soft and pudding is mushy. Find ten different textures around your house. Make a list of your 10 objects and their textures. Try to make a texture rubbing by putting
a piece of paper over your object and rub the side of a peeled crayon over it.

Rainbow scavenger hunt. Find an object in your house for each color. Line up the objects in rainbow order: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple. Take a picture and e-mail it to your teacher.

Trace your hand 3 different times on a sheet of paper. In one hand, draw all of your favorite foods. In the next hand, draw activities you like to do. In the last hand, color it your favorite colors.
