<p><b><u>Nursery Rhyme Clap:</u></b> Say a nursery rhyme while clapping to the beat. Examples to try: *One, Two Buckle My Shoe *Hickory Dickory Dock</p>	<p><b><u>Sing a Song:</u></b> Perform a song, same song 4 different ways: whisper, hum, speak, and sing.</p>	<p><b><u>Watch a musical with your family:</u></b> A musical is a play or movie in which singing and dancing play an essential part to the story. I recommend: *Annie *Mary Poppins *Aladdin (2019)</p>
<p><b><u>Cut the Cake:</u></b> Teach your family to sing and play this game we played in music:  Clap your hands together Give a little shake Make a happy circle Then you cut the cake</p>	<p><b><u>Learn a Classic:</u></b> Learn the tune and lyrics to: "She'll Be Comin' Round the Mountain"</p>	<p><b><u>Nature Filled Xylophone:</u></b> 5 glass bottling jars. Find different nature items to put in jars. Use sticks or wooden spoons to tap on glass jars. Experiment with sounds. A jar filled with mud will have a lower tone than a jar filled with pinecones.</p>
<p><b><u>TP Tube Musician:</u></b> Find an empty toilet paper tube. Using markers, yarn, tape, glue, glitter, pipe cleaner, etc. create a musician. Which instrument are they playing? What materials did you use to make the instrument?</p>	<p><b><u>Baby Bumblebee:</u></b> Learn the tune and lyrics to baby bumblebee. Once familiar change the lyrics. What else could you bring home? What happens at the end? Ex: I'm bringing home a little joey...oops, he bounced away from me.</p>	<p><b><u>Louis Armstrong:</u></b> Louis' nickname is, "Satchmo." He became famous for jazz music. He would solo on his trumpet or sing in songs. Listen to a few of his songs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Wonderful World</li><li>• Hello Dolly</li><li>• Ain't Misbehaving</li></ul>
